

Workshops as a teaching method are fairly new for the international belly dance community, starting around the early 1980s. Workshops give us the opportunity to study with visiting teachers, learn new techniques and materials and study a pre-selected topic with intensity.

Not long ago, Hawai'I had few workshops to attend. I remember when I started dancing all the major dance artists had taught in Hawaii BEFORE I started (Jamilla al Wahid, Amaya, Morocco, Horacio Ciufuentes to name a few). My have the times (thankfully) changed! In a single calendar year from March 2005 to the present, in the Hawaiian Islands the following instructors have taught seminars: Dalia Carella, Jehan Kamal, Rachel Brice, Kajira Djoumana, Aisha Ali, Meissoun of Switzerland, Shoshanna, Hyetti al Shams, Delilah, Saqra, Suhaila Salimpour and this month, Said al Amir of Munich, Germany. Locally, MEDAH had it's teacher workshops with Mercedes Foster, Gale Fenna, Ruth Cuti and Kalae Kaina, and both Shamira & Willow gave master classes.

One of the many things I love about this dance is that you'll never reach a point of knowing everything! Our dance is so diverse, and it's always evolving. You can remain continually inspired- and I hope each of you find that joy DAILY! Please enjoy the Z, send us your thoughts and articles and we hope to see you dancing or at a workshop!

<u>March featured dancer... Said al Amir</u>



From the heartland of Germany to the heart of Hawai'i arrives Said al Amir. On his first U.S teaching and performance tour, Said is set to share his unique and diverse styles. Said began his journey in the arts with a solid foundation and training in classical music & opera. He performed extensively in his youth in both opera and musical theater. In 1987, Said was introduced to the world of Middle Eastern Dance through teacher Yasmin al Ghazali. It was a life changing event that has led him to his current passion. From 1987 to 1995, Said and Ms. Ghazali (now residing in Spain) co-founded a dance academy, creating a German and Spanish partnership. ESTODA was born, which represents the Essential Technique of Oriental Dance. In addition to Middle Eastern Dance, Said has also studied extensively with master teachers in the fields of

Said is the sole creator and founder of JOMDANCE, jazz oriental modern dance, a new dance fusion that seamlessly combines the best of the aforementioned styles. His knowledge about music and theory, the cultural origins and interpretations of the art continue to keep him in demand as both an instructor (as a pedagogue, choreographer and coach for numerous established dance artists and groups) and as a performer.

And can he dance! Said literally rocked the house at last year's Rakassah Festival and pre-show dinner show, wowing the audiences with his style, charisma, flawless technique and boundless energy. Said's JOMDANCE style reminds me of the best of Bob Fosse, the best of Ballet and the best of Modern Egyptianstirred, shakened and smoothed out with perfection. It's an infectious and compelling style! During workshops, he was approachable and offered guidance and help to confused students that were at a loss. I

often saw Said explaining concepts to attendees, and looks of frustration melted into smiles of understanding. Said certainly lives up to his motto- and then some **"Said al Amir- once you have seen him, you will neve**r
